

THE DOMAIN AT A GLANCE


The Live Performance domain brings together over **3,600** establishments with employees nationwide. It contributed a total of \$2.2 billion to Canada's GDP, or 5.1% of the cultural sector's overall economic contribution from cultural products in Canada.

Live Performance represents a diverse group of performers and organizations engaged in the production of live entertainment, such as operas, orchestras, circus, and festivals.

BREAKDOWN OF CULTURAL SECTOR GDP (\$ BILLION)




EMPLOYMENT BREAKDOWN BY REGION (%)



SHARE OF WORKING PART TIME




EDUCATIONAL ATTAINMENT DISTRIBUTION (%)





DOMAIN'S DISTINCT FEATURES*

- 100% of workers are found in creative and artistic production occupations.
- More than 40% of workers are self employed, compared with 28 % in the overall cultural sector.
- Almost 25% of workers work part-time, compared to less than 10% in the cultural sector.
- The average annual income for Live Performance workers is 22% lower than the cultural sector average and 30% lower than the Canadian average.
- The domain's workforce is much younger than the average for the cultural sector and the overall economy. More than 40% of workers are younger than 35 years old, compared with 35% or less in the cultural sector and the overall economy.
